Awards committee report (L. Campbell & T. Dimick)

 Sara Calaman and Samantha Bennett were the recipients of this year's student leadership awards (undergrad and graduate, respectively)

Department Update (John Floros (by phone))

- Dr. Floros is resigning from Department head and will start a position at Kansas State University as Dean of Agriculture in July. The search for a new department head is starting.
- In Oct there were 195 undergrad students and 220 estimated for next year. 30 students will graduate in May and 60-70 freshman are estimated to start in August. Penn State is estimated to be the largest program in Food Science
- There are 50 graduate students and 10 post docs
- There is a search for 3 faculty positions:
 - 1 tenure track
 - o 1 non-tenure
 - 1 staff (manager labs and pilot plant)
- We may not have a budget cut this year ©
- Dr. Coupland has been elected to the Board of Directors for IFT
- There have been a large number of student and graduate student awards
- Food Science is a large program in the college of Ag, however, has one of the smallest faculty
- Dr. Floros's recommendations for future role of FIG in the Food Science Department include:
 - Continue student support, especially faculty guidance of students concerning careers
 - o Raise money for scholarships, student support, faculty chairs, research
 - Help new department head (TBD), especially with determining strategy of the department

New Business

Monetary Award for Students

- Reviewed draft of award for students traveling abroad
- Group agreed to finalize draft at summer meeting and advertise in mailing for tailgate

IFT Annual Meeting Support

PA Food Innovation Network Update (Jerry Rundle)

- The 1 year grant from PA which funded the start of the network was extended to December 2011. The outcomes for the food industry were not only a well-attended conference and showcase in November 2011 but also a website, www.pafoodinnovationnetwork.com. A new grant request was submitted and should be considered for funding in April or May. That grant would move the responsibilty of the Network to Larry Grunden at PennTap. There also is funding for a part-time industry person to assist with maintaining the website and handling the conference and other industry events.
- The good news is that all of the information network members and website are housed outside of the state or university. So if the state does not fund the initiative we have an option to take this up with a consortium of organizations. The downside of that approach is that it becomes a volunteer activity until further funding is identified and without a dedicated resource like Larry working on this it will be tougher to grow especially at this early stage of the Network. At the meeting last night we did get some interest from Keystone IFT and Harrisburg University to be part of continuing the Network, so if we had the Philly IFT and the PS FIG involved also (along with Penn State Berks who handled all the filing of the grant) we could still maintain the Network, have an updated website, and even hold a conference and showcase again.
- We will send out information to all the Network members once we hear about the funding, which should be within two months. If anyone has any questions or ideas please contact Larry, Hassan Gourama, or me.
